NewFound Road joined forces in July of 2001 and recruited longtime friend and award winning producer, Ben Isaacs to produce their self-titled debut album. The first recording garnered lots of attention from the Bluegrass and Southern Gospel scenes. Bluegrass Unlimited Magazine stated "NewFound Road has clearly established a new standard of excellence by which future bluegrass gospel recordings will be measured."



This album gained them their first of many nominations with SPBGMA at their awards show in Nashville, TN. The band crisscrossed the nation in 2002 playing Bluegrass festivals, Southern Gospel concerts and churches.

The combination of touring and their highly acclaimed debut project set the stage for a very successful 2003. NFR headed back in the studio with Ben Isaacs to record their second project, Full Heart for Mountain Home Records, based in Arden, NC. Once again, music critics loved the recording. Bluegrass Unlimited wrote "Vocally NewFound Road is as solid as they come...But they are equally as strong as instrumentalist," NFR was nominated for Horizon Group of the Year at the Singing News Magazine awards show held at the extremely popular National Quartet Convention. The band was also nominated for several awards at the SPBGMA show in Nashville.

NewFound Road recently recorded their first secular album entitled Somewhere Between. In a relatively short time, NewFound Road is fast becoming a major force in the Bluegrass and Gospel music markets.

Glorybound



Glorybound is a Southern Gospel group that organized in 1993 and is based in Broken Bow, Oklahoma. Members include: Scott Brumley, Marion Brumley, Tammy Hughes and James Fields. Glorybound has currently made five recordings. Wherever Glorybound ministers, people are blessed and encouraged by the Holy Spirit. The sincerity of this group is evident during each concert.

Wade Hayes



Raised in Bethel Acres, Oklahoma (pop. 2000), he grew up loving country. "A lot of the other kids were into mainstream pop," he says. "But country always moved me. I've never liked any kind of 'lite' music. It's nice, sure, and it may put people at ease. But I like a little tension - I've got to feel something in music." Moving to Nashville in the early 90s in hopes of playing lead guitar with an established star, Wade soon got more than he bargained for. Hooking up with veteran songwriter Chick Rains, he immediately co-penned two songs that would soon become #1 chart toppers, "Old Enough to Know Better" and "I'm Still Dancing with You." With a writing deal and a record contract under his belt, he was ready to hit the big time. After recording multiple albums and having top 10 singles under his belt, "I just keep singing and playing lead guitar -- that's what I love to do. I don't worry about expectations, I just keep moving ahead," he says.
